


ATLA Religion Database with ATLASerials

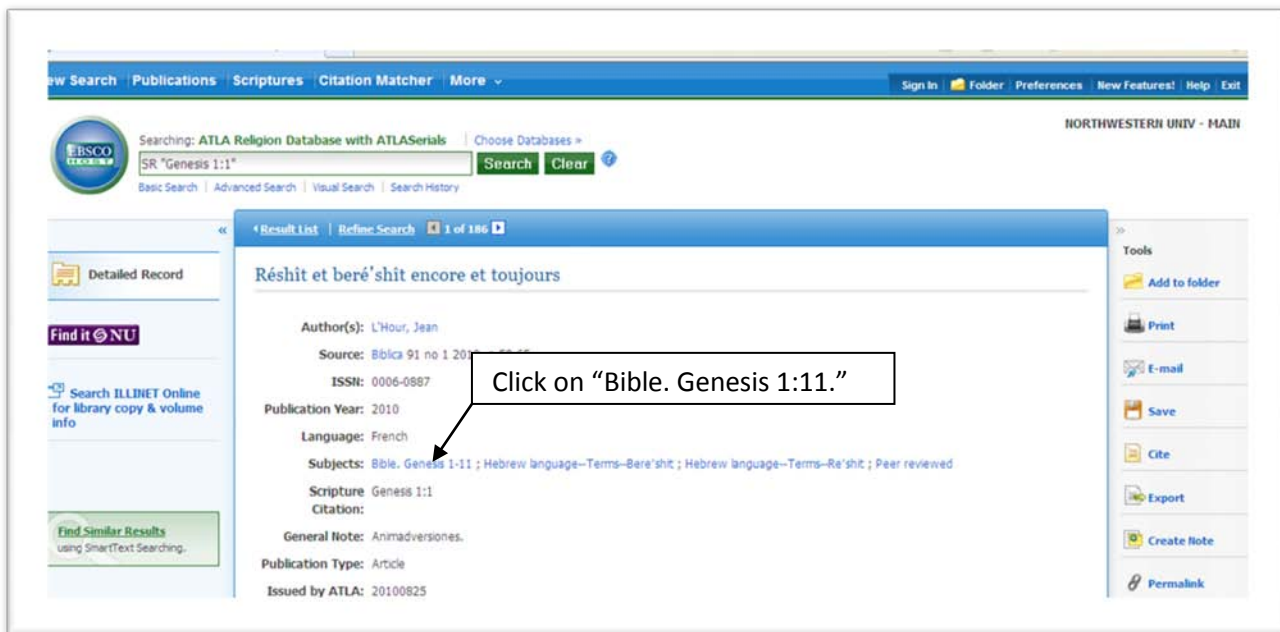
For example, if you want to find articles on Gen 1:1, click on the [Expand] following Genesis, and then on the [Expand] following Chapter 1, and then finally click on Verse 1 to generate a list of entries in the database relating to Gen. 1:1. Keep in mind that this is not an exhaustive list. If you find yourself coming up short, then you might try a subject search instead. A subject search is a broader search and will yield a greater number of results.



Clicking on the title of a record will display the full record and highlight the subject terms so that when you click on one of the subject terms, a new search will be done. For example, click on the title in record no. 1 below.



Now it is possible in the full version of the record to click on the subject term "Bible. Genesis 1-11." This will do a new search with a new set of results.

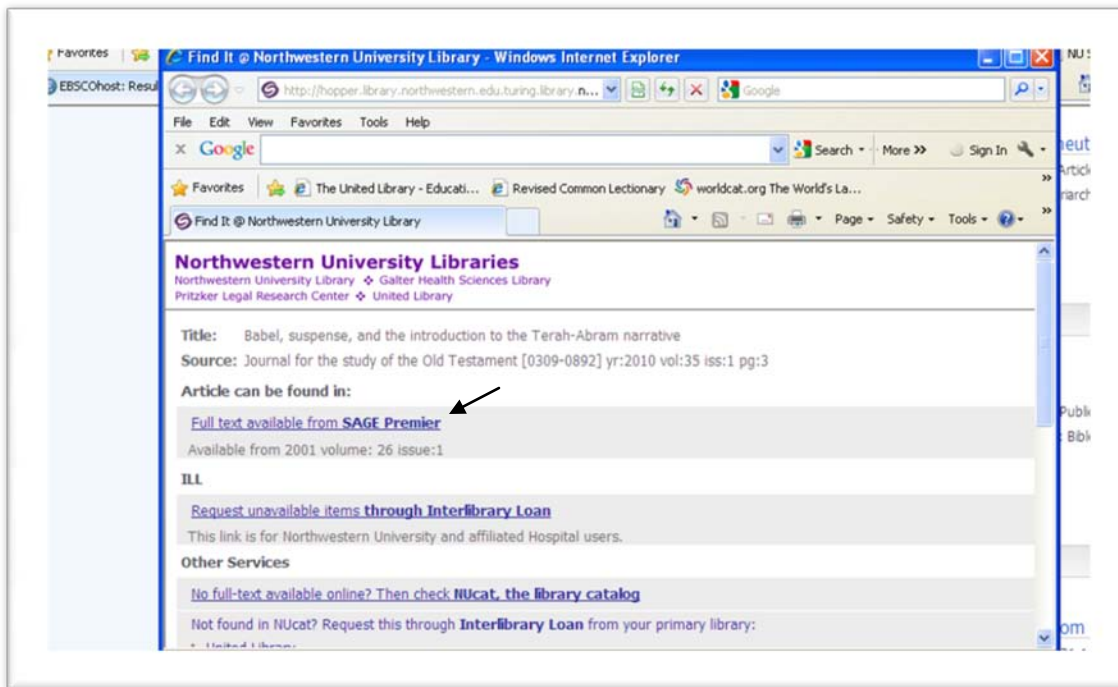
